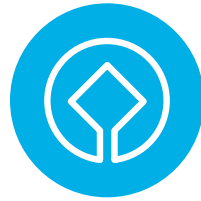

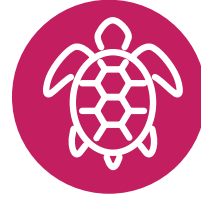

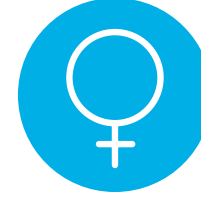

The only Anglophone country in Central America, it has thousands of hectares of virgin forest to explore, including the only protected area for jaguars in the world. Swim with exotic marine life along the longest barrier reef in the Western Hemisphere. 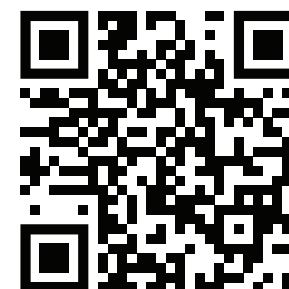

Although the country is small and covers only 0.03% of the planet's surface, it has the privilege of being the habitat of 5% of the existing biodiversity throughout the world. A 25.58% of its territory is protected under various forms of conservation.

ITINERARY

Day 1: Arrival in San José, Costa Rica

Upon your departure from the Juan Santamaría Airport in San José, Costa Rica, a local representative will meet you for your transfer to the hotel.

Overnight in San José.

Day 2: San José - Poás Volcano – Arenal Volcano

At the specified time, departure to visit the Poás Volcano. Our path takes us through grasslands, coffee, ferns, and strawberry plantations to the unique Volcano National Park. The active crater of the Poás Volcano, with temperatures between 40° to 70°C, is the largest volcanic crater in the world. Then we will go north of the Central Mountain Range to La Fortuna, located on the Arenal volcano. The afternoon at the foot of the perfect



volcanic cone is at your entire disposal to take pictures. We will spend the night in a hotel in the Arenal region, near La Fortuna.

Day 3: Arenal Volcano

After breakfast, we will embark on a hike through the humid tropical forest and the lava fields at the foot of the Arenal Volcano, with the opportunity to observe monkeys, toucans,

and a variety of other species of birds. From the hiking trail you will see La Fortuna Waterfall, which is located near the Arenal Volcano and is surrounded by a lush forest.



Then we will walk along the hanging bridges in the treetops. At the end of the day, return to the hotel. We will spend the night at a hotel in the Arenal region near La Fortuna.

Overnight in La Fortuna.

Day 4: Arenal Volcano – Las Tablillas - Solentiname



Immediately after breakfast, we will take the bus to “Las Tablillas” which is one of the border crossings between Costa Rica and Nicaragua. Here, the tour guide will help you handle the border formalities. Once we have crossed the border, another tour guide will take over, and we will continue to the port of San Carlos to take the boat. After a tour of the historic fishing village, we will start the boat trip to the Solentiname Archipelago, a Nicaraguan National Monument. The archipelago is made up of 36 islands with tropical forests, colorful houses, and a colony of naïf art painters. Upon reaching Mancarrón, the main island, we will go to the beautiful hotel with tropical gardens that invite you to relax.

Overnight at Hotel Mancarrón-Solentiname.

Day 5: Los Guatuzos Nature Reserve



After breakfast, we will transfer by boat to the “Los Guatuzos” Nature Reserve. This site is the first internationally recognized RAMSAR wetland in Nicaragua. The boat will navigate through the Papaturro river, in a small jungle near Solentiname. You will discover a beautiful tropical forest with a unique biodiversity: monkeys, crocodiles, iguanas, sloths, turtles, toucans, and white herons, the guardians of the nature reserve.



On the way we will take a short walk to learn the deepest secrets of the rainforest. With a little luck, we will see the poison dart frog and the toucans. Return to the hotel at lunch time. In the afternoon we will take a boat ride and will visit a family of naïf art painters on the island of Venado, where three generations have dedicated themselves to this art school. Return by boat and walk to the hotel.

Overnight at Hotel Mancarrón-Solentiname.

Day 6: Solentiname - Juigalpa - Granada



The day starts very early with breakfast and then transfer by boat from Solentiname to San Carlos. Upon arrival, travel by land to the capital, Managua. Along the way we will be able to observe the change in the landscape and will make a stop in Juigalpa to visit the Gregorio Aguilar Barea Archaeological Museum. This museum has several pieces of stone and other artifacts from the Amerrisque mountains. Some of the impressive basalt statues are over four meters tall, and some can be found in famous

museums like the Louvre in France. We will continue the journey to the colonial city of Granada. Check-in at the hotel upon arrival.

Overnight in Granada.

Day 7: Granada - Islets - Lake Nicaragua



After breakfast at the hotel, we will enjoy a walking tour of the city of Granada, the oldest colonial city in the Americas, and currently one of the nation's tourism centers. Founded by Francisco Hernández de Córdoba in 1524, its squares and cobbled streets are full of colorful colonial architecture. Attractions to see in Granada include the House of the Lions or House of the Three Worlds, the main and central square, the Municipal Palace, and the Cathedral. On the way, you can climb the stairs of the La Merced church tower and enjoy a fantastic view of the city from the roof. In the afternoon, take a decorated horse-drawn carriage to the port and end the day with a relaxing boat ride through the more than 300 islets formed during a volcanic eruption in the great lake of Nicaragua. This is a great opportunity to enjoy the tropical aquatic flora and fauna.



In the afternoon we will go to the Masaya Volcano National Park for a spectacular night tour to the crater of the active Santiago volcano, where you will appreciate the bright and burning lava.

Return and overnight in Granada.

Day 8: Granada - Catarina - Managua – Panama City



In the morning, we will visit the impressive Catarina scenic viewpoint, from here you can see the volcanos, the Apoyo Lagoon, and the large lake. We will visit San Juan de Oriente, with its beautiful gardens and colorful alleys, where we will visit the Valentín López ceramic school (Point of Life), where you will discover the secrets of local ceramic crafts. Then we will continue to Managua, the country's capital. Upon arrival we will take a

panoramic tour of the city, including visits to the Revolution Square with the old Cathedral, the National Palace, the Rubén Darío Theater, and the beautiful Malecón, the lakefront. Around noon, transfer to the Managua international airport to take the 2:30 PM Copa Airlines (CM105) flight to Panama City. Upon your arrival transfer from the airport to the hotel. *Overnight in Panama City.*

Day 9: Panama Canal and Panama City's Old Town

After breakfast we will visit the Panama Canal. We will observe the passage of a cruise through the gigantic locks across the canal, which takes place at noon and in the shadow of the ocean liners that sail through the Miraflores lock. This is an exciting event worth appreciating, where you will also learn about the history of the waterway, from the difficult beginnings to the current self-government. In the afternoon we will visit the old town of Panama with the Government Palace, venerable churches, and wonderful cafes.

Overnight in Panama City.

Day 10: Panama - Dominican Republic

Early transfer from the hotel to the Tocumen International Airport in Panama City to take the Copa Airlines (CM748) flight that leaves at 9:45 AM for Punta Cana, in the Dominican Republic. Arrive in Punta Cana where you will be welcomed by a local representative to transfer you to the all-inclusive hotel, which will allow you to enjoy everything so you can have fun on a beach surrounded by palm trees, white sand, and soft Caribbean waves.

Overnight in Punta Cana.

Day 11: Punta Cana

This day is destined for you to enjoy your vacation in the beautiful white sand beaches and all the attractions that you will find in the resort.

Overnight in Punta Cana.

**Day 12: Punta Cana**

After breakfast we will come along for an excursion in a catamaran to Saona Island. Return to the hotel.

First, you will arrive in Santo Domingo, a destination with a lot of history and culture and a prelude to the beautiful beaches of Punta Cana with its vibrant nighttime entertainment, marine exploration, and relaxation activities that will make this trip an unforgettable journey.

observe the great diversity of agriculture present during the trip, among them: ferns, flowers, strawberries, as well as the cattle ranches and the view of the central valley, which creates a beautiful landscape.

These 2,708-meter (8,000 ft) tall colossus is active, and you will not only be able to admire its impressive crater and gas emanations, but also you will learn about its phreatic and fumarolic activity, as well as the different ecosystems and lush vegetation found in this beautiful national park. We will continue our way to the La Paz Waterfalls. Upon arrival we will walk along a beautiful path leading to different attractions of the park, including the aviary, the largest butterfly observatory in the country, the hummingbird gallery, the serpentarium, the exhibition of frogs, monkeys, and cats. Eventually a delicious buffet-style meal awaits us in the middle of the rainforest, at the end we will take a walk where we can visit three imposing natural waterfalls formed by the La Paz River itself. Return to the hotel.

Overnight in San José.

Day 3: Arenal and Baldi

The impressive Arenal Volcano is a natural wonder found in La Fortuna de San Carlos, Alajuela, offering thousands of tourists the opportunity to appreciate the columns of white smoke, ash, and fumarolic activity emanating from the conical colossus. It is important to bear in mind that the volcano had been dormant for at least 450 years, until July 29, 1968, when it experienced a major eruption, starting a new period of pyroclastic activity which has been decreasing in the last few years.

On the way to the Arenal Volcano, we will make a stop in the famous town of Sarchí, known as the cradle of Costa Rican artisans, where you will have the best opportunity to acquire souvenirs such as wood crafts, clothing, and souvenirs in general. The journey continues, through forested areas, as well as plantations of various agricultural products, including coffee, pineapple, ornamental plants, and cattle farms, until we reach the beautiful town of La Fortuna, to stop and enjoy a meal in a cozy restaurant with a spectacular view of the Arenal Volcano.

After lunch we will visit a scenic viewpoint that is closer to the base of the volcano where, in turn, the view of the Arenal Lagoon is appreciated.

Eventually, you will relax in one of the best hot springs in the area, where they can enjoy its rejuvenating effects, as well as a massage (optional activity) or other special treatments that must be booked in advance. Baldi's facilities offer the tourist 25 pools of thermal water, which flows naturally from the volcano. Return to the hotel.

Day 5: Departure from Costa Rica to Panama

Day 3: Bocas del Toro

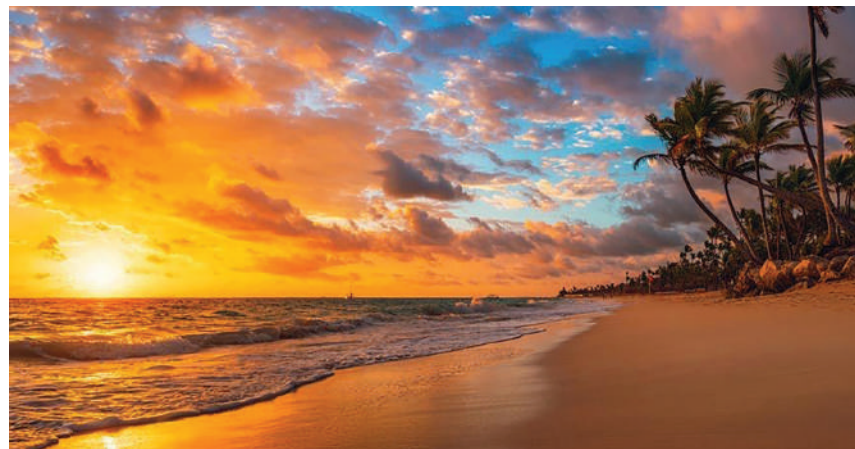

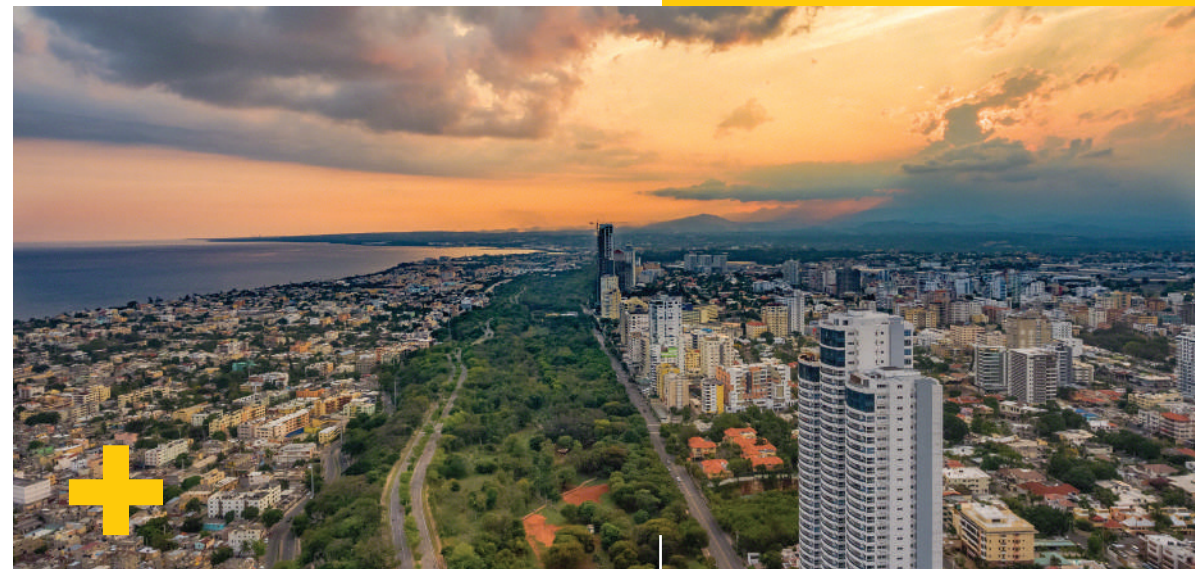

From there we will continue to Cabo Rojo and Bahía de las Águilas, passing through the Laguna de Oviedo, a flamingo reserve, until we reach the Glamping Ecolodge. After check-in, we will take a boat to one of the five most beautiful beaches in the world according to CondeNast magazine: Bahía de las Águilas, where you can go snorkeling.



You will enjoy a paella with white wine on the beach and in the afternoon, we will return to the Glamping Ecolodge to have dinner at the restaurant and sleep next to the sea in tents.

Overnight at Glamping Ecolodge in Cabo Rojo.

Day 6: Bahía de las Águilas (Eagles Bay) - Santo Domingo

On the way back we will go to the hotel to taste and

live the experience of a Geisha Coffee Filtering. Then you will have free time to rest.

Overnight at the Boquete Tree Trek Hotel in Boquete.

Day 8: Boquete - Soloy-Azuero Indigenous Community

After breakfast we will take the Inter-American Highway, via private transfer, to the Soloy Community in the Nogbe Buglé Indigenous Region. Here you will enjoy the impressive KiKi Waterfall. After a walk of approximately 25 minutes, you will enjoy the imposing fall of approximately 100 meters. You will have free time to swim and enjoy nature, with a small natural snack included. Then we will return to the town where you will taste native dishes and drinks in the Mro Restaurant. We will then continue our journey in a private transfer until we reach the Azuero Region, specifically the Pamel Agrotourism Farm or the Cubitá Hotel where you will have dinner and rest.

Day 9: Azuero - Herrera and Los Santos



You will enjoy a delicious typical Panamanian breakfast and will learn how to prepare a *Changa*, which is nothing more than a yellow corn tortilla. Then we will tour the farm and visit the archaeological site of Cerro Juan Díaz. Then, we will go to the town of Pesé, where we will visit La Hacienda San Isidro, cradle of Rum Abuelo and Seco Herrerano. We will also enjoy a visit by cart to the sugar cane fields, learning about the aging cellars, as well as tasting the different rums and even the Centuria, rums that have won many quality awards. We will finish with a delicious typical lunch.

In the afternoon, we will take the tour of a Little Piece of Azuero, where you will learn how the famous Pan de La Arena is prepared, having the opportunity to taste its bread and sweets at the San Pablo Bakery.

In addition, we will visit pottery artisans where you get to try making a clay figure using a manual lathe. We then go to a picturesque town called Monagrillo, where you will visit “La Araña Sin Rival,” the oldest bar with more than 80 years. Here you will get to taste the “Seco con Leche,” the

traditional drink of the festivities. Finally, you will meet Don José Mascaras, a craftsman who makes the devil masks. We will return to the farm and will have a simple explanation of how the Polleras are made. Dinner on your own (not included in the package costs).

Overnight at the Pamel Agrotourism Farm or the Cubitá Hotel in Azuero.

Day 10: Azuero - Los Santos - Panama

After breakfast, we leave for the city in a private transfer, but not before visiting the Church of San Atanasio in Villa de Los Santos and its small town.



Upon arrival in the city and after the hotel check-in, we will go to the Old Town to visit the Museum of La Mola and then we continue with the visit to the Golden Frog to taste craft beers, and learn about the history of the Old Town, its Churches, and its colonial infrastructure. We close the night with dinner at the Casa Catedral Antique Car Collection Restaurant.

Day 11: Panama City - Nicaragua - Managua | Colonial City of León

After breakfast, we will visit the Panama Canal and then we will head to the airport via private transfer to continue our journey to Managua-Nicaragua.

¡Bienvenidos a Nicaragua!



When leaving the airport's custom area, look for your Nicaraguan ambassador who will have a sign with your name on it. Continue the day with a 2-hour transfer to the colonial city of León. On the way you will visit the historic site "Ruins of León Viejo," founded by the Spanish in 1524

and declared by UNESCO as a Historical-Cultural World Heritage Site. It is one of the oldest Spanish colonial settlements in America, and it is the place where the city of León was originally founded. The next stop will be La Paz Centro municipality, land of clay artisans and the famous typical dish "Quesillo." After this short gastronomic stop, you will continue to the city of León.

León, known as the "University City," is the second largest city in Nicaragua after Managua. In León we can find two UNESCO masterpieces: the ruins of León and the Cathedral of León.

Overnight in a standard room at El Convento Hotel in León.

Day 12: AM Visit to Cerro Negro Volcano & PM Visit to Colonial León



Breakfast at the hotel. Meet your guide in the hotel lobby to start a fabulous day full of activities. After a 50-minute drive you will arrive at the base of the Cerro Negro Volcano, a young volcano 726 meters high



above sea level and easily accessible. After approximately 45-60 minutes hiking you will reach the top to enjoy the great landscape where you will have the opportunity to see the volcanic chain “Los Maribios.” Once you have enjoyed the incredible view from the top, you will descend the steep slopes of the volcano on foot, using the same volcanic sand to regulate your descent speed, or using a special table for your descent. Upon your return to León, you will have free time at the hotel to prepare for the second part of the day.

Learn about the history and culture of the university, poetic, revolutionary and one of the oldest and most influential cities in Nicaragua. During the tour, visit the Cathedral of León, a UNESCO World Heritage Site; the Heroes and Martyrs Mausoleum, where you will learn a little more about the participation of the Leonese in the Sandinista Revolution of 1979. The Rubén Darío Museum, located in the house where the poet grew up, you will learn more about his influence on the Spanish language. You will also get to see the main colonial buildings.

Overnight in a standard room at El Convento Hotel in León.

Day 13: Attractions Granada Colonial City and Islets boat ride

Breakfast at the hotel. Today we travel to our second colonial jewel, the colorful and beautiful Granada. Upon your arrival you will enjoy the colonial architecture of the churches and houses with nice and beautiful patios. You will visit Central Park, which is the heart of the city, among other places of interest.

To end the day, you will enjoy a relaxing boat ride through the famous Lake Nicaragua Isletas. During the tour you will enjoy a panoramic view of the Mombacho Volcano, pass by the houses of native families that live on the islets, the San Pablo Fortress, restaurants, and private vacation homes. It will also be a wonderful opportunity to observe the great variety of flora and fauna in the area.

Overnight in a room with a balcony at the Plaza Colón Hotel in Granada.



Day 14: White Villages & Masaya



Breakfast at the hotel. The day excursion begins in San Juan de Oriente, part of Los Pueblos Blancos. This beautiful town is distinguished by its various artisan workshops, in which there is an active and diverse production of attractive pieces of clay and ceramics. You will have the opportunity to visit an emblematic workshop in the area to learn about the origin, the process, and appreciate the finished pieces. You will also visit El Mirador de Catarina, one of the highest hills surrounding the Apoyo Lagoon with an incredible view. You will then go down to the shores of the Apoyo Lagoon for a typical lunch while you enjoy the nature that surrounds the area.

The second part of the day includes a visit to the Masaya Volcano National Park, where you will get to see its most active crater and its surroundings, as well as the magnificent flora and special fauna of the site. A few minutes by bus is the city of Masaya, known as the mecca of Nicaraguan crafts. Visit

with your guide the different options where you can buy souvenirs made by the hands of Nicaraguan artisans.

Overnight in a room with a balcony at the Plaza Colón Hotel in Granada.

Day 15: Granada - Peñas Blancas - Monteverde

Breakfast at the hotel. Guided private transfer to the Peñas Blancas border crossing.

Welcome to Costa Rica!

Upon arrival at the Peñas Blancas border crossing, you will take a private transfer to the beautiful town of Monteverde. The transfer will take around 3 hours and 15 minutes, with approximately 186 km. You will arrive at your hotel in Monteverde for check-in and will have time to rest and enjoy the facilities offered by the hotel.

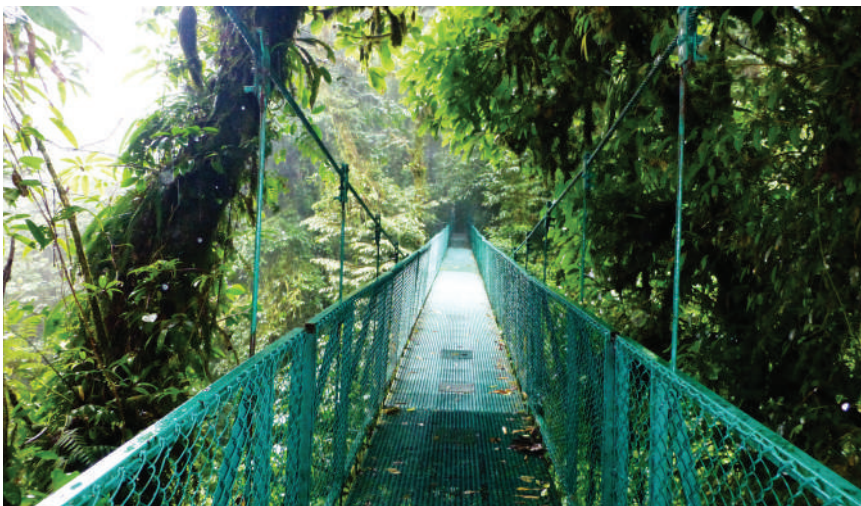




In the afternoon you will enjoy a shared guided tour in the Monteverde Reserve. This two-and-a-half-hour tour begins with an introductory video about the Monteverde Cloud Forest, during which you will learn about the expectations of the tour, the rules of the park, and will also receive a flashlight to be used during the walk. The tour begins at the El Colibrí Gallery, where you can watch flying bats. Afterwards, the trails extend for approximately 1.8 km surrounded by lush vegetation and different animals, such as insects, birds, and nocturnal mammals. This is an excellent opportunity to experience the true nightlife in the forest, to appreciate the different perspectives of the jungle when it gets dark, and to live the incredible experience of observing the behavior of some animals and plants at night. Fluorescent mushrooms and fireflies are an important part of the show. The Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve will allow you to explore magical nature by maximizing your senses. Bring comfortable and warm clothing, footwear suitable for walking, a raincoat and insect repellent. Tour includes transportation, bilingual guide, and entrance fee to the reserve.

Overnight in a classic standard room at the Monteverde Country Lodge Hotel in Monteverde.

Day 16: Monteverde Sky Tram, Trek & Walk



After breakfast at the hotel, you will have the opportunity to venture on the shared Monteverde Classic Sky Tram, Trek & Walk tour with a nature guide and transfers included. This tour begins with the Sky Tram gondolas, which rise delicately over the rainforest, offering invaluable landscapes along the way. This tour is perfect for all those people who want a different contact when admiring nature, without making any physical effort, but just at the point where nature exhibits all its magic. During the 20-minute tour you will be attended by a professional bilingual guide who will show you characteristics of the flora, fauna, and other important aspects of the journey.



The Sky Tram ascends through the mountains until you reach an observation platform at the highest point of the reserve, where you can enjoy the wonderful scenery. From this area, you will begin to slide on a series of zip lines that extend in the middle of the treetops, thus beginning the exciting adventure descending the mountains. Next, a series of trails and hanging bridges will offer you more than a unique experience, since you will be coexisting with the flora and fauna of the forest and will have a vision of the forest from a different point of view.

Overnight in a classic standard room, with breakfast included at the Monteverde Country Lodge Hotel in Monteverde.

Day 17: Transfer/Excursion via Lake Arenal

Start the day with your breakfast at the hotel and then you will take shared transportation to the Arenal area via Lake Arenal. This service, half transfer, and half excursion is a fast and scenic way to go from Monteverde to La Fortuna (Arenal area).

You will leave your hotel in Monteverde and have a journey of approximately 1.5 hours to Río Chiquito (during the rainy season, this transfer may take a little longer). Once in Río Chiquito, you will board a comfortable and safe pontoon boat and after a 30-40-minute journey you will arrive at Lake Arenal. After a 30-minute minibus ride, you will arrive at your hotel in the Arenal area.



Lake Arenal is the largest and most important in Costa Rica, it is artificial and was built in 1974 to obtain hydroelectric energy for the country. It is also a place where you can find a variety of resident and migratory birds. Sometimes it is possible to observe mammals such as monkeys and sloths in the surroundings of the place, in addition to excellent views of the

Arenal Volcano when it clears. It is advisable to bring long pants, a coat, comfortable shoes, a camera, binoculars, sunscreen, and a raincoat.

In the afternoon, you will enjoy the shared Sloth Bear tour, with transportation, certified guide, snacks, and drinks included. During this activity, which lasts two hours, you will have the opportunity to admire two or three-toed sloths, this being the most popular species in the region, and to learn about its natural history and other important information that you may not have imagined. Your guide will look for the best places to observe them in their natural habitat, leading you through beautiful open areas of La Fortuna and, at the same time, being able to see some more species such as the multicolored toucan, the blue poison frog, iguanas, and monkeys, among others. Bring comfortable clothing, walking shoes, sunscreen, camera, and binoculars.

Overnight in a standard room, with breakfast included at the Arenal Paraíso Hotel Resort & Spa Hotel in Arenal.

Day 18: Shared Tour Raft Safari and tortilla class





After breakfast at the hotel, you will take a shared raft Safari tour and then a tortilla-making class. During this tour, you will enjoy the sights and sounds of Costa Rica's wildlife with the Safari Float from La Fortuna to Arenal. This trip takes place on the Peñas Blancas river. Without a doubt, it is a quiet tour that will allow you to enjoy the tranquility of the Costa Rican rainforest to immerse yourself in all the sights and sounds of the tropical environment. Be sure to keep an eye out for a wide variety of monkeys, alligators, iguanas, Jesus Christ lizards, and a wide variety of colorful bird species.

The river is home to small crocodiles that hide underwater when you pass by.

The nature guide will share with you his local history and knowledge of the plants and animals that you encounter during the tour. In about two hours you will enjoy, at a relaxing pace, exploring the banks of the river

and the jungle's inhabitants. At the end of the tour, you will depart for the tortilla-making experience and visit a local family. This time, at the house of Doña Maras, who will help you better understand the meaning of "Pura Vida" that Costa Ricans experience. You will be greeted with a tropical drink at the "rancho" and will enjoy a delicious traditional lunch after preparing tortillas. You will learn to flatten the tortilla dough, in perfect circles, ready to cook.

It is recommendable to wear quick-drying clothes, bring a change of clothes, sunscreen, water shoes, insect repellent, camera, and binoculars. The tour includes transfers, guide, lunch, equipment, and snacks.

Overnight in a standard room with breakfast included at the Arenal Paraíso Hotel Resort & Spa in Arenal.

Day 19: Departure - Private transfer to the International Airport

Breakfast at the hotel, hotel check-out at the agreed time and departure, via private transfer, for the Juan Santamaría International Airport to take the flight out and return to your country of origin. This transfer will take approximately three hours and 15 minutes. Please consider that passengers must be at the airline counter 3 hours before flight departure.

Overnight at the four-star Porta Hotel in Antigua Guatemala.

Day 7: Antigua – Panajachel – Boat Ride - Antigua

The day will begin with breakfast at the hotel, and transfer to Antigua at the scheduled time to visit Panajachel, one of the 14 towns that surround the beautiful Lake Atitlán. The ride takes about three hours, but it is an indescribable journey. During the ride you will have the opportunity to see the road adorned with different colors, thanks to all the products that are grown in the most productive part of Guatemala. As you travel the road you will see onion, tomato, corn, pumpkin, carrot, and zucchini plantations, and many other products that are used for local consumption as well as for exports to other countries.



Arrival and lunch at Casa Blanca restaurant in Panajachel. After lunch we will board a boat that will take us on a tour of a town located on the slopes of the volcanoes that surround the beautiful lake.

Arrival and visit to the town of Santiago de Atitlán (on the other side of the Lake), a town of descendants of the Tz'utujil Mayans where a guide will show you part of their culture. We will take the opportunity to visit the deity of Maximón, part of the religious syncretism between the Mayan worldview and religion. We will walk through the market enjoying the colors of their products and they will show you what their beautiful fabrics mean and how their beautiful Mayan headdresses are placed. We will then return to Panajachel and from there to Antigua Guatemala, making a strategic stop to eat at one of the traditional restaurants of the region. At the end we will resume the ride back to the hotel.

Overnight in Antigua Guatemala.



Day 8: Antigua Guatemala

After breakfast at the hotel, the guide will take you on an interesting tour of the city of La Antigua Guatemala founded on March 23, 1543, where you will admire the architecture of the majestic old buildings. Antigua Guatemala is famous for its Spanish colonial buildings, many of them restored after the 1773 earthquake that ended La Antigua's 200-year rule as the colonial capital of Guatemala. Due to its historical importance and beauty, UNESCO declared it a World Heritage Site in 1979.

Time for lunch and then for a walk through the cobble streets where there are buildings that are still preserved and are original from the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. You will be able to enter what once were convents, churches, and houses of residence, to look at them from the inside. Later, we will visit the crafts market, the museum, and the Jade factory. At the end of the day, return to the hotel.

Overnight in Antigua Guatemala.

Day 9: Antigua Guatemala – El Salvador – The Country of Smiles

Breakfast at the hotel and hotel check out. At the scheduled time we will pick you up for the transfer to El Salvador - the Country of Smiles. The first arrival will be to the Ahuachapán Town located in "La Ruta de las Flores" which will take you through charming towns that are in the Sierra Apaneca Lamatepec and that in turn belong to the Biosphere Reserve of the same name. These towns are surrounded by lush coffee plantations, many of them winners of the Cup of Excellence.

Arrival and check in at the hotel in the town of Ataco. It is time to eat and for this we will visit the Bosque Tayua Restaurant, located in a small cypress forest in the coffee mountains. Here you can not only live the coffee experience, but it is also your opportunity to learn about this product and its different forms of preparation.

You cannot miss the obligatory visit to the El Carmen Coffee Processing Plant, founded in 1930. This processing plant has been preserved through four generations implementing an interesting process of transformation to high-quality or Gourmet coffee. We will take a guided tour to learn how coffee is converted from coffee beans to fine export coffee. At the end of the day, return to the hotel in the town of Ataco.

Free afternoon/evening (Ataco: variety of restaurants, craft shops, parks, and the Church, among other attractions).

Overnight in the town of Ataco.



Day 10: Route of the Flowers (Town of Ataco) – San Salvador



Very early breakfast and hotel check out. Depart the town of Ataco for Salcoatitán, where we will visit the Botanical Garden of Bromeliads, a collection of beautiful tropical American plants, and will continue to Nahuizalco, our last stop on the Route of the Flowers. We will have free time to visit and buy souvenirs to take home in this beautiful town famous for its handicrafts made of wicker and tule.

Then, we will head to San Salvador, and on the way will also visit El Boquerón National Park, named after its largest volcano crater, worth getting to the edge to contemplate the force of nature in the huge crater. After this visit we will transfer to a local restaurant where you can eat with a wonderful view of the capital city. On a clear day, you can see Lake Ilopango and the Chinchontepec and San Vicente volcanoes on the horizon. After lunch we will visit the Historic Center of San Salvador, which has old buildings and squares that are an important part of the history of this country. At the end of the day, we will transfer to the hotel to check in. You will have the night free to explore on your own.

Overnight in San Salvador.

Day 11: Suchitoto



Start the day with your breakfast at the hotel, and head out to take a guided tour including a visit to the Cihuatán Archaeological Park, an ancient city that emerged after the mysterious “Mayan Collapse” and became the regional capital between 900 and 1200 AD. We will continue to the colonial town of Suchitoto, city founded by the Nahuatl and means “Place of Birds.” We will have the opportunity to visit the indigo workshop with local women. The indigo or Jiquilite dye is a native plant from tropical areas and has been very important for the country since pre-Hispanic times, during the colony, and today.

Transfer to a restaurant for lunch, and then visit the port of San Juan where we will take a boat ride on beautiful Lake Suchitlán. We will take a tour of the largest water mirror in El Salvador, a Ramsar site, and the scenario for the visits of migratory water birds. We will then take a walk in Suchitoto, paying visits to its beautiful church, the Alejandro Cotto Museum, and some other places of tourist interest, and will end the day with a visit to a workshop of “pupusas”, a Salvadorian traditional dish.

Return to the hotel and overnight in San Salvador.



Day 12: Departure - Transfer to the International Airport

Breakfast at the hotel and transfers to the International Airport for your departure flight at the scheduled time.

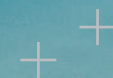
